Intent

Technical

Small building blocks to structure learning, with consolidation of learning through regular reviews and activities progressively becoming more complex.

Instrument extensions encourage students to engage with instrumental learning, opening doors for future academic or vocational study.

Constructive

Introduces and explores interrelated elements of music using musical terminology.

Circular learning, building on key skills across the ten-week programme and revisiting this learning in more depth every year within a coherent four-year spiralling curriculum.

Expressive

Simple, age-appropriate, call and response songs regularly recapped to embed learning.

Structured repetition of activities promotes resilience.

Opportunities for expressive music-making through performance and composition.

Sequencing

Flexible 10-week schemes of work designed to progressively encounter, explore, and develop musical skills and knowledge with in-built scaffolding to accommodate all learners.

Structured and in-built repetition: small, incremental steps in learning, continually revisited to embed understanding, develop resilience and reinforce learning.

Pedagogy

Process-based approach to learning: supporting teachers to facilitate the creative process through modelling, guiding, and offering opportunities to experiment and refine ideas and skills without necessarily having to lead.

Pupils meet creative intentions:

- understand and explore how music is created, produced and communicated
- experiment with, select and combine sounds using interrelated dimensions of music
- listen to music with concentration and play untuned and tuned instruments musically
- use their voices expressively and creatively in a call and response song, singing collectively and pitching accurately



Culture

Thriving musical culture fostered by **world-class musicians**, with a **distinctive** 'Music at Home' feature which extends the reach of the music curriculum beyond the school community, **strengthening cultural education** outside of the classroom.

Activities are planned to encourage the spiritual, moral, social, and cultural development of pupils, improving cultural capital and facilitating broad personal development through music.
